

Kodak Retina Camera Manual

This book is the 3rd Fascicle in the series of Retina Collector's Guides from Dr. David L. Jentz. It covers Kodak Retina and Retinette cameras manufactured from 1945 to 1954. There are 84 pages with over 250 images which include detailed photos of production changes, camera manual covers, original camera boxes and special features. Many features of this book have never been published previously. This is a must for the Retina collector as it contains the classic Kodak Retina Ila Type 016.
