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development theory, present the Developmental State model, and discuss the regulatory and developmental roles of the state in a market economy. The research for this account draws primarily on primary documents from archival and field research conducted by the author—including company documents and in-depth interviews, government reports and policies, and trade publications and data sources, which is supplemented with secondary sources where relevant.
