La huella de Al-Ándalus es mucho más profunda y extensa de lo que pudiera parecer con un análisis superficial del tema. La huella más visible es la del patrimonio en forma de palacios, mezquitas convertidas en iglesias, alcazabas, torres, murallas, etc. Para la existencia de este tipo de huella no es necesario que haya habido una continuidad poblacional, como tampoco es necesaria esa pervivencia para otro de los legados, el científico, que como conocimiento pasa a formar parte del patrimonio de otras culturas. Pero hay otro tipo de huellas que han pervivido hasta ahora que sí que necesitan para su transmisión a lo largo del tiempo de una pervivencia poblacional, muy difícil pervivencia en muchos casos, sin la cual no se entendería ese legado. Una parte de esa población se adaptó rápido, religiosa y socialmente, a la nueva sociedad conquistadora del siglo XIII, de la que por cierto, no divergía tanto como pudiera pensarse. Otra parte de la población andalusí, la que decidió seguir conservando su religión musulmana o judía dentro del territorio ya conquistado, tuvo una adaptación mucho más traumática a raíz de la intransigencia de poderosos sectores de la iglesia católica. De una forma u otra, una parte importante de la población andalusí

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siguió habitando el territorio peninsular y, con mayor o menor grado de asimilación a la sociedad cristiana, intervino en la conformación de esa nueva sociedad. Así pues, debemos tener en cuenta esta premisa para poder entender la gran importancia del legado de al-Ándalus, no sólo en relación al patrimonio sino también a la idiosincrasia del pueblo andaluz que tiene mucho que ver con la del pueblo andalusí. El amor por la poesía, la música, la fiesta; su interrelación con la naturaleza; la conformación del paisaje agrario; la arquitectura popular; la forma de comer, de rezar, de ver la muerte y la vida, de hablar, de nombrar a los lugares y a sí mismos; en definitiva, la cultura, pues todo ello junto es lo que antropológicamente se conoce como cultura, no se entendería actualmente sin la existencia de la cultura andalusí, de la que es heredera, y que a su vez es heredera, en gran parte, de la cultura grecorromana anterior.

In his short life, he wrote dozens of articles on film, several plays, screenplays, novellas, and countless short stories, with a prominent focus on social discord. He committed suicide at the age of 25.

The Bec Hellouin model for growing food, sequestering carbon, creating jobs, and increasing biodiversity without using fossil fuels When Charles and Perrine Hervé-Gruyer set out to create their farm in an historic Normandy village, they had no idea just how much their lives would change. Neither one had ever farmed before. Charles had been circumnavigating the globe by sail, operating a floating school that taught students about ecology and indigenous cultures.

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Perrine had been an international lawyer in Japan. Each had returned to France to start a new life. Eventually, Perrine joined Charles in Normandy, and Le Ferme du Bec Hellouin was born. Bec Hellouin has since become a celebrated model of innovative, ecological agriculture in Europe, connected to national and international organizations addressing food security, heralded by celebrity chefs as well as the Slow Food movement, and featured in the inspiring César and COLCOA award-winning documentary film, Demain ("Tomorrow"). Miraculous Abundance is the eloquent tale of the couple's evolution from creating a farm to sustain their family to delving into an experiment in how to grow the most food possible, in the most ecological way possible, and create a farm model that can carry us into a post-carbon future—when oil is no longer moving goods and services, energy is scarcer, and localization is a must. Today, the farm produces a variety of vegetables using a mix of permaculture, bio-intensive, four-season, and natural farming techniques--as well as techniques gleaned from native cultures around the world. It has some animals for eggs and milk, horses for farming, a welcome center, a farm store, a permaculture school, a bread oven for artisan breads, greenhouses, a cidery, and a forge. It has also become the site of research focusing on how small organic farms like theirs might confront Europe's (and the world's) projected food crisis. But in this honest and engaging account of the trials and joys of their uncompromising effort, readers meet two people who are farming the future as much as they are farming their land. They envision farms like theirs someday being the hub for a host of other businesses that can drive rural communities—from bread makers and grain millers to animal care givers and other tradespeople. Market farmers and home gardeners alike will find much in these pages, but so will those who've never picked up a hoe. The couple's account of their quest to design an

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almost Edenlike farm, hone their practices, and find new ways to feed the world is an inspiring tale. It is also a love letter to a future in which people increasingly live in rural communities that rely on traditional skills, locally created and purveyed goods and services, renewable energy, and greater local governance, but are also connected to the larger world.
